Other great things happening over the summer include the Buckeye Municipal Airport receiving a \$275,000 grant from the FAA. This grant money will repair and replace asphalt and concrete on the taxiway at the southern end of the airport. In addition, the airport will add edge lighting around the taxiway and ramp area as part of this project too.

We've also been busy planning our popular Fall events you count on and look forward to every year. This includes Oktoberfest, our Halloween Carnival, Veterans Day Parade, Demolition Derby, Holiday Boutique, the Buckeye Marathon, Glow on Monroe and so many more.

The city's website has a calendar feature for you to learn more about each event. These events are a great way to meet your neighbors, experience some of Buckeye's history and spend quality time with your family. I hope to see you at one of these great events.
