

Bulk Trash Service Requirements

CITY OF BUCKEYE

Public Works Department

Bulk trash is a quarterly service, offered to help you dispose of bulky items too large for the trash can. This service is not for construction or demolition debris. For a full description of acceptable items, please see below. The City of Buckeye code, chapter 9, is available online at municode.com.

Please note: All residences in Buckeye must have a current sanitation account with the city. Bulk trash service is only available within the city jurisdiction.

- Placement time: Place materials out the night before service. Materials may be out as early as the weekend before service. §9-2-4-B. & C
- Never place bulk trash in an alley §9-2-4-E
- Bulk piles may be no larger than **6' x 6' x 6'**. You are responsible for waste over this amount.
- Place items in a NEAT pile. Tree limbs, branches, and palm fronds must be bundled (stacked and tied), or contained in an easily handled bundling material such as a tarp, sheet, or box. Small items must be bagged. §9-2-4-L
- Place the pile at the front edge of your property, parallel to the curb, not on the sidewalk, street, or right-of-way or near an obstruction. §9-2-4-E
- If your home has no street-front, place your pile at the end of the nearest HOA landscaped area, NOT in the road or sidewalk.
- Do not place the pile near a fixed object, or in any way that may interfere with motor or pedestrian traffic. §9-2-4-F

Good to Go!

- ✓ Furniture: Mattresses/Box Springs/Couches
- ✓ Bicycles
- ✓ Loose debris (bagged) §9-2-4-L.4
- ✓ Appliances emptied of all material. Freon containing appliances must be emptied and tagged by a certified technician. It will not be removed without a tag. §9-2-3-D.5
- ✓ Water softeners, grills emptied §9-2-3-D.5
- ✓ Lawn mowers emptied of all fluids. Leave covers off. §9-2-3-D.5

- ✓ Cardboard collapsed and bundled (stacked and tied) §9-1-11-D.4.G, §9-2-4-K.7
- ✓ Construction/demolition material under 25lbs (created by a resident, not contractor) §9-2-4-L
- ✓ Pipes, tree limbs, branches, or any long items: cut to three foot (3') lengths, bundled (stacked and tied). §9-2-4-L.
- ✓ Thorny plants: cut to three feet (3'). Boxed for safe collection. No more than fifty (50) pounds. §9-2-4-J.

- Mousehold Hazardous Waste (paint, chemicals, oil, batteries, Freon)** §9-2-3-D, §9-1-11
- ∅ Infectious or medical solid waste, sharps (needles), and medicines §9-2-2-B.6
- Metal, automobile parts over fifty (50) pounds §9-2-4-K.2.
- Ø Tires (take to county transfer station) §9-2-3-D
- Uncontained glass (windows, doors, table tops mirrors create a significant public safety hazard) §9-2-3-D.
- Bricks, concrete, dirt, rocks, asphalt, roofing, toilets, counters or similar materials §9-2-4-L
- Whole bushes or trees, vegetation not bundled (stacked and tied), or loose grass and clippings §9-2-4-L

Too Much Trash?

If you have more bulk trash than then will fit in a 6' x 6' x 6' space, we have the following remedies:

- O Residents may take trash to the landfill for a small fee for the first 600 pounds, more than 600lbs will increase costs. Bring your City Trash Service Bill to receive the residence price. The Landfill is on the east side of SR 85, at 24427 S US HWY 85, Buckeye.
- O Republic Services provides **self-scheduled** bulk collection, payable to Republic Services. Call 602-455-3353 to schedule this service.
